## The Regatta

I know that several of our families will have hosted and supported various crews this week. It is always a great joy to welcome rowing crews from all over the world as they compete in the Regatta. Last weekend, we welcomed St Joseph's, 'the Jesuit prep' from Philadelphia. The crew have been competing in the Princess Elizabeth Cup, which is their first experience of rowing outside America, and of the Henley Royal Regatta. Having safely navigated Wednesday, they were part of Thursday's most dramatic race. The crew were chasing at the two previous time barriers, and their efforts enabled them to come back at the finish line to win by two feet!



I was pleased to be able to congratulate them and meet their President, Fr John Swope S.J. and their Chaplain, Fr. Chuck Frederico, S.J. (or to give him his full title: *Senior Director of Mission and Ministry*). On Thursday, we welcomed Fr Chuck with the parents and families of the crew as they celebrated Mass here.

I am sure they will be very proud of their efforts, and look back fondly on this experience, even if there were a few tears following such an emotional journey. I was pleased to offer Fr Chuck an arm around the shoulder, and warm congratulations. We wish them *'God Speed!'*
