The Sacrament of the Sick

Jesus' cured many who were sick and he sent his disciples to do the same, 'So, they set off to preach repentance, and anointed many sick people with oil and cured them.' (Mark 6:13). St James said, 'If one of you is ill, he should send for the Priests of the Church, and they must anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord and pray over him. The prayer of faith will save the sick and the Lord will raise him up.' (James 5:14-16)

James' instructions have become the model of the Church's care for its sick members. The Church recognises her call from Christ to support and care for the sick. Christ is with us always, but especially when we need him most. The Church celebrates this reality by the Sacrament of the Sick. In this sacrament, the sick are supported, comforted and receive the strength of Christ.

The celebration of the sacrament has three distinct parts which follow the example of Jesus and James. These are the Prayer of Faith, the Laying on of Hands and the Anointing with Oil.

The Prayer of Faith. James asked the priests to pray over the sick person. At the beginning of this sacrament, the entire community represented by the Priest, the family and friends, gather to pray with the sick person. In this way, the sick person is assured of the prayers of the parish community.

The Laying on of Hands. Jesus healed the sick by the laying on of hands or even by the simple gesture of touch. The Priest lays his hands on the sick person. This is a prayer for the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the sick person. We pray that through the power of God's healing grace, the sick person may be restored to health, or at least strengthened in a time of illness.

The Anointing with oil. The Church's use of oil for healing is closely related to its remedial use in soothing and comforting the sick and restoring the tired and weak. The sick person is strengthened to fight against the physically and spiritually debilitating effects of illness. The oil of anointing is the sacramental sign of the presence, power, and grace of the Holy Spirit.

In each of these ways, we follow the prayer and example of Christ as we bring his healing presence to the sick. It reminds us that the care of the sick is the ongoing focus of Christ and his Church. Fr Paul
